TAYLOR, CLINTON WILLIAMS Clinton Williams Taylor, son of Mr. and Mrs. George M. Taylor, III, of Birmingham, died on February 15, 2010, at age 16. Clinton is survived by his parents, by brother George Malcolm Taylor, IV, and by sisters Lottice Howell Taylor, and Emma Bolling Hall Taylor. He is also survived by grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry C. Howell, Jr. of Dothan, Alabama, and Mrs. George M. Taylor, Jr., of Birmingham (formerly of Prattville), and by Miss LuVenia Stewart of Birmingham. Clinton was an honor student at Mountain Brook High School with plans to attend college after graduation. In school, he was a member of the Chamber Choir, the Latin Club, and the Interact Service Club. He was an active member of the Debate Team and had traveled to several major debate tournaments, including the Wake Forest Tournament, where he won first place in the J/V Lincoln-Douglas Debate rounds. Clinton was an Eagle Scout with Troop 28 and had served in several leadership positions, including senior patrol leader and junior assistant scoutmaster, and had participated in a number of high adventure outings, including a trip to Philmont Scout Ranch in the summer of 2009, where he served as trek leader. He was active in the youth group of Independent Presbyterian Church and sang in the Westminster Choir. He served on the Youth Subcommittee, the Search Committee for the Assistant Youth Director and as an acolyte. Clinton's life was notable for his loyalty to family and friends, his steadfast faith, his sense of humor, and his enthusiasm for life. A memorial service will be held at 4:00 p.m., on Thursday, February 18, at Independent Presbyterian Church, with visitation to follow in the Great Hall.
